Christian Johnson was a Norwegian merchant marine who at 15 immigrated to the U.S. and naturalized in Seattle. He married and moved to Spokane where he fathered children and homesteaded 330 acres in this area. His 1st wife died, and he remarried. He built a house, bunkhouse, barn, water silo, and outbuildings. Only the barn and silo remain. The barn and silo have local significance and are landmarks. The barn was used for a dairy production and cattle ranching. I was told by a local man who as a boy drove a tractor along the road when he lost control. He decided that his only hope was to head toward the barn. If that barn could stop the tractor, he would survive.
