### **97 1058** MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT

The Agreement is entered into this // day of // 199 //, by and between the County of Spokane (hereinafter "County"), acting through its Historic Landmarks Commission ("Commission"), and BELAND. AL KANGER CHAMAN (hereinafter "Owner(s)"), the owner of the property located at 5705 5. CUSFIR Pd., commonly known as May BROWNE HOUSE in the County of Spokane.

WHEREAS, the City of Spokane adopted Ordinance C-26353 on November 23, 1981; and

WHEREAS, the County of Spokane adopted Ordinance 82-0038 on January 12, 1982; and

WHEREAS, both Ordinance C-26353, as amended, and Ordinance 82-0038 provide that the City/County Historic Landmarks Commission (hereinafter "Commission") is responsible for the stewardship of historic and architecturally significant properties in the City and County; and

WHEREAS, the County has authority to contract with property owners to assure that any owner who directly benefits by action taken pursuant to County ordinance will bind her/his benefited property to mutually agreeable management standards assuring the property will retain those characteristics which make it architecturally or historically significant;

NOW THEREFORE, -- the County and the Owner(s), for mutual consideration hereby agree to the following covenants and conditions:

- 1. <u>CONSIDERATION</u>. The County agrees to designate the Owner's property an Historic Landmark on the Spokane Register of Historic Places, with all the rights, duties, and privileges attendant thereto. In return, the Owner(s) agrees to abide by the below referenced Management Standards for his/her property.
- 2. <u>COVENANT</u>. This Agreement shall be filed as a public record. The parties hereto intend this Agreement to constitute a covenant that runs with the land, and that the land is bound by this Agreement. Owner intends his/her successors and assigns to be bound by this instrument. This covenant benefits and burdens the property of both parties hereto.
- 3. <u>ALTERATION OR EXTINGUISHMENT</u>. The covenant and servitude and all attendant rights and obligations created by this Agreement may be altered or extinguished by mutual agreement of the parties hereto or their successors or assigns. In the event Owner(s) fails to comply with the Management Standards or any County ordinances governing historic landmarks, the Commission may revoke, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing, this Agreement.
- 4. <u>PROMISE OF OWNERS</u>. Owner(s) agrees to and promises to fulfill the following Management Standards for his/her property which is the subject of the Agreement. Owner intends to bind his/her land and all successors and assigns. The Management Standards are: "THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR'S STANDARDS FOR REHABILITATION AND GUIDELINES FOR REHABILITATING HISTORIC BUILDINGS (Revised 1983)." Compliance with the Management Standards shall be monitored by the Historic Landmarks Commission.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provision of RCW Chapter 36.32.120(6), the Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County has the care of County property and the management of County funds and business; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Spokane County Code Chapter 1.48, the Board of County Commissioners is required, in conjunction with the designation of properties as historic landmarks, to enter into a management agreement, the purpose of which is to insure that the owners of such property agree to appropriate management standards of the same; and

WHEREAS, the Spokane Historic Preservation Office has advised the Board of County Commissioners that the Historic Landmarks Commission has approved the nomination of Guy Brown House as a historic landmark, and in conjunction therewith, has requested that the Board of County Commissioners approve such designation and enter into a management agreement for the same; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County, based upon the recommendation of the Historic Landmarks Commission, that the Board does hereby approve the recommendation of the Historic Landmarks Commission that Guy Browne House be designated a historic landmark, and additionally, that either the Chairperson of the Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County, or a majority of the Board, be and is hereby authorized to execute that document entitled "Management Agreement", pursuant to which, under certain terms and conditions, the owner of Guy Browne House will agree to certain management standards in conjunction with the designation of the property as a historic landmark.
